United Caring Services is committed to creating a community that will break the cycle of poverty and homelessness through championing those that are marginalized, empowering them to lead hopeful and productive lives.

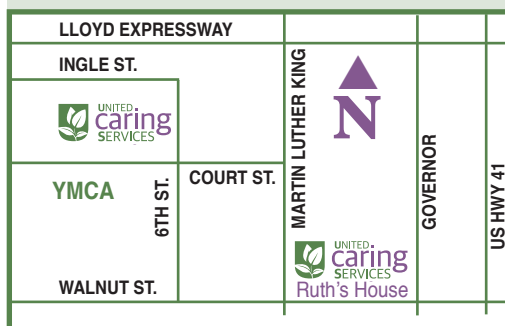
our core values

Fiscal Year (June 1 - May 31)

In Evansville, on any given night, there are at least 450 individuals in emergency homeless shelters or transitional housing programs. Approximately one-third of these are children under the age of 18. Uncounted others are living in places not meant for habitation. They share the same values, dreams and aspirations we all have. Many lack the basic skills to fulfill these dreams. As a result, they are unemployed and under privileged. They need our help and most of all, they need hope.



a message from the executive director

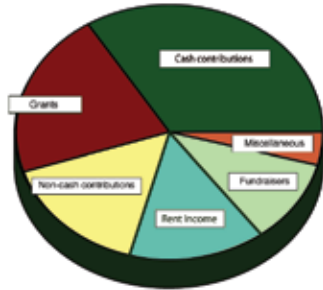

Thank you for supporting the United Caring Services' mission toward a sustainable community of caring and thank you for the privilege of serving on your behalf.

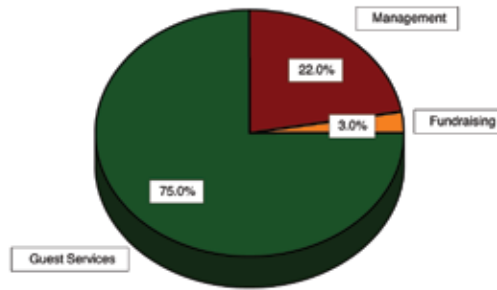
